


This is a section through an archaeological excavation. Match each dated object to the layer from which it was dug.




Object Search

Colour those objects that an archaeologist might find on an excavation.


Next to the drawings list the objects that an archaeologist might find only on a waterlogged site.





Building Reconstructions


Which of the archaeological plans below (1-6) goes with each of the reconstructed buildings (A-E)? There will be one plan left over.

The Village of Millbrook End
